Magazine

In addition to the main Club which caters for all members in the UK and overseas; we have branches around the country. Club Services

The “Services” page of the website describes the services provided by the Club, including: –

- BTH generator testing and repair

- Miller stator plate conversion to accept Ford car-type contact breakers.

- Cylinder head skimming
- Oil pump overhaul

Technical Information

Copies of the Velocette Parts Lists and Service Manuals appropriate to each machine type can be purchased from the online Spares shop or from the Historian depending on the particular model and age. Details on the “Services” page of the website.

Collections of technical articles from OTLand other sources have been compiled into two volumes of Technical Notes. These can be downloaded by members free of charge from the “Services” page of the website. The articles are grouped into sections covering 'Engine', 'Gearbox', 'Fuel System', 'Electrics' etc and a comprehensive index allows relevant information to be quickly located.

Many of the Velocette factory engineering drawings have been scanned. A catalogue and prints are available to members from Alan Britch.

Historian

The Club holds the Velocette factory records which help the Historian provide advice on the history of individual machines and help with DVLA re-registration problems. He has also written articles on both historical and current LE-related topics which are published in OTL and on the "Historian's Notes" page of the website.

Advice on technical problems

The Technical Secretary will try to help with advice on difficult issues. He gets very busy, so please make every endeavour to find the solution from the manuals, Technical Notes, the Forum etc before contacting him.

Club Spares

The Club has extensive stocks of new and used parts. The 400 or so most popular parts can be purchased from the Club's online Spares Shop. If you want other parts (either new or second-hand); then there is an enquiry process to find out if we have the part in question, its cost and how to purchase it online.

The spares scheme relies on a small number of volunteers who meet weekly at the Club's premises in Walsall. To enable them to cope with the numbers or orders it is **essential** that you follow the guidance on the "Spares Information" page of the website before trying to order parts or send an enquiry about parts that are not yet listed.
